<b>Main Content</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The module focuses on the concept “text” and various textual forms.</li> <li>• Attention is paid to the use of rhetorical skills in the construction of texts and the meaning of discourse analysis.</li> <li>• Various textual types, i.e. news reports, drama and poetry are analysed.</li> <li>• The own creation of a text/texts is an integral part of the module.</li> </ul>
