<b>Main Content</b>	<p>This is a continuation of the second year level module Afrikaans Journalism and Media Studies. We work on a more advanced abstract level which requires more advanced practical work, among which ethical issues, the nature and impact of media laws and press codes as well as producing in-depth articles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The emphasis is on the development of "new media" with attention to the nature and essence of journalism in the modern media and the ethical, political and legal issues related to these new developments and challenges.</li> <li>• Students are expected to produce a variety of texts at a more advanced level.</li> </ul>
