<b>Main Outcomes</b>	<p>On completion of this module students should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Acquire the basic academic literacy skills required at a higher education level.</li> <li>Write in a well-structured academic way with clearly and coherently expressed ideas and acknowledged and referenced sources.</li> <li>Edit their own work with the input of their lecturer and sometimes with the help of peer-editing.</li> <li>Extract and interpret the meaning of both literary and non-literary texts through critical reading and engagement with their lecturer and peers.</li> <li>Analyze texts in a logical and nuanced manner.</li> </ul>		
<b>Main Content</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The course is taught in small groups so as to facilitate interaction between students themselves and their lecturer.</li> <li>Students analyse, discuss and write about a variety of different texts.</li> <li>All texts are organised around key themes that encourage critical thinking.</li> </ul>
