<b>Main Outcomes</b>	<p>On completion of this module, students should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A knowledge of the contents, nature and theology of the individual books.</li> <li>• The ability to place the biblical material in historical context.</li> <li>• A basic understanding of the history of Israel during the pre-monarchic and monarchic periods.</li> <li>• An understanding of the critical and interpretative problems concerning these books and of the methods used by scholars in dealing with these problems.</li> <li>• The ability to use knowledge and skills gained in the course to deal with individual passages from these books (assignment).</li> </ul>		
<b>Main Content</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Introduction to the books of the Former Prophets (Joshua to II Kings) and to a selected number of books from the Latter Prophets (for instance, Isaiah, Amos, Hosea, Jeremiah, Deutero-Isaiah).</li> <li>• With respect to the Latter Prophets, the books selected may vary from year to year, but the emphasis will fall on prophecy up to the time of the Babylonian Exile.</li> <li>• Attention will be given to: Israelite history in the context of Ancient Near Eastern history, the origins and role of the Israelite monarchy as institution, the origin, development and nature of prophecy in Israel, the connection between prophecy and specific historical circumstances, the content and theological thrust of the individual books.</li> </ul>
