

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION HONOURS IN EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY (Full Time - 4117)/(Part Time - 4118)

E.126 ADMISSION

Unless otherwise determined by the Senate, students may be admitted to study for the BEd (Hons) in Educational Psychology degree for non-degree purposes if they have: **Bachelor of Education Honours in Educational Psychology – BEdHons (Educational Psychology)**

E.126.1 A university degree and have obtained an average of 60% in Psychology III or its equivalent and

E.126.2 One of the following teaching qualifications;

- a) Teaching qualification(s) recognised by the University as equivalent to M+4, or
- b) Advanced Teachers Diploma or
- c) A Higher Diploma in Education (Non-graduate) awarded by the University of the Western Cape and

E.126.3 Two years teaching experience, or

E.126.4 Qualifications agreed by the Senate to be equivalent and two years teaching experience.

E.127 SELECTION

As only a limited number of students can be admitted to the programme, applicants will be subject to a selection procedure.

E.128 DURATION

Unless Senate decides otherwise the duration of the programme shall extend over one year full-time or two years part-time study.

Assessment is governed by Rule A.5 as stipulated in the University Calendar: General Information Part 1.

E.131 PROGRESS RULES

E.131.1 Full-time

Unless Senate decides otherwise, a full-time student shall complete the programme in one year. A student who passed at least 60 credits may proceed with his/her studies to complete the programme the following year.

E.131.2 Part-time

Unless Senate decides otherwise, a part time student shall complete the programme in two consecutive years and accumulate at least 60 credits per annum to proceed with his or her studies. A student who accumulated 90 credits within two years may be allowed to proceed to the following year to complete the programme.

E.132 RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION

The renewal of registration will be governed by the Rule A.4.1.2, as stipulated in the University Calendar: General Information Part 1.

E.133 SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROGRAMME

E.133.1 Students may appeal to Senate to have their modules taken for extra-curricular enhancement purposes recognised for the purposes of a BEd (Hons) degree.

E.133.2 80% attendance is compulsory for all modules in the BEd (Hons) programme.

E.133.3 The Senate reserves the right to require BEd (Hons) students to satisfy coursework requirements, in addition to passing the appropriate examinations, before the degree shall be awarded. Prerequisites and limitations for the various modules and areas of focus, will be found in the Student Guide.

E.133.4 The Senate reserves the right not to offer a given area of focus or module every year and to offer additional areas of focus or modules. The Student Guide may be consulted in this regard.

E.133.5 The offering of areas of focus for which fewer than 20 students register, is at the discretion of the Senate.

E.133.6 The maximum number of semester modules which can be taken per semester is 4 in the case of a full-time student and two in the case of a part-time student.

E.133.7 Students may, as part of their area of focus and up to a maximum of the equivalent of two semester modules, select an available module enrol for a module at Honours or equivalent level in another Faculty in the University. Information on the conditions under which this option may be exercised, will be found in the Student Guide.
