J.354 ADMISSION

Unless Senate decides otherwise, candidates will be required to meet the following criteria to be enrolled for the degree: **Master of Philosophy Sport for Development - MPhil (Sport for Development)**

J.354.1 A relevant 4 year degree, an Honours qualification or equivalent professional qualification in a cognite field of study.

J.355 SELECTION

As only a limited number of students can be admitted to the programme, applicants will be interviewed by a panel and they should demonstrate a basic knowledge of the field of sport, development and conflict transformation. Current work experience in these areas will be an added advantage.

J.356 DURATION

Unless Senate decides otherwise the duration of the programme shall extend over three years.
